NOTICE OF RACE

The Organising Authority is the Chichester Harbour Federation (CHF)
in conjunction with Hayling Island Sailing Club (HISC) PO11 9SL. This notice may be changed until 1 July 2012

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 Racing rules 27.2 (moving starting marks), 32 (shortening or abandoning after the start), 29.2 (recalled starts for Series C), 61.1(2) (informing the protestee), A2 (series score) and 63.1, A4 and A5 (penalties) will be changed. The changes will appear in full in the Sailing Instructions. The Sailing Instructions may also change other racing rules.
- 1.3 Competitors should note that the organising authority implements the RYA Racing Charter and that they will be required to undertake to sail in compliance with the charter, which can be found in the RYA rule book (Racing Rules of Sailing 2009-2012) or at www.rya.org.uk/racing/charter

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The regatta is open to boats listed in the race programme.
- 2.2 Entries may be made on line at www.chifed.org until 2200 hrs on Friday 17 August, or in person at the HISC clubhouse on Saturday 18 August 13.00-17.00 hrs, Sunday 19 August 13.00-18.00 hrs and 20-24 August from 08.00 hrs.
- 2.3 All helms (and if under 18, their parent or guardian) must complete the entry form accepting the conditions of entry.
- 2.4 A change of helm or boat constitutes a separate entry.
- 2.5 Competitors are reminded that standards of behaviour suitable for a family regatta week (including the use of appropriate language) are expected at all times throughout the regatta, both afloat and ashore, and whilst attending any CHF club. Competitors will be held accountable for the behaviour of their guests whilst attending the regatta.
- 2.6 Competitors shall grant to the organising authority without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show any report, result, motion or still pictures and live, taped or filmed television of or relating to the events.

3 FEES

- 3.1 Entry fees (per boat):
ADULTS: £ **tba** for the series or £ **tba** per day, (single-handed £ **tba** or £ **tba**)
YOUTH: (under 18 on 20.8.2012) £ **tba** for the series or £ **tba** per day, (single-handed £ **tba** or £ **tba**).
- 3.2 Other fees: boats over 3m not already in possession of a Chichester or Langstone Harbour Plaque will be charged additionally £3.50 for the week or £2 for up to two days

4 SCHEDULE

- 4.1 Classes (events), class flags and start times will be as per the race programme
- 4.2 Handicaps will be RYA Portsmouth Yardstick (PY) numbers unless otherwise set by the race committee. Boats without a PY number may apply to enter events 1, 2, 5, 11 & 16.
- 4.3 There will be one race a day for Series A and B. For Series C there will be two races Monday to Thursday, the second immediately following the first, and one on Friday.
- 4.4 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race on Monday 20 August is 12:30.

5 MEASUREMENTS

Boats and equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with class rules.

6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be available on the CHF website www.chifed.org and may be changed until 1 July. They will also be available at registration.

7 VENUE

- 7.1 The event is based at Hayling Island Sailing Club, Sandy Point, Hayling Island, PO11 9SL.
- 7.2 Racing will take place in Chichester Harbour. A chart of the racing area will be available on the CHF website no later than 1 July.

8 THE COURSES

The courses will be issued with the Sailing Instructions at registration.

9 PENALTY SYSTEM AND PROTESTS

- 9.1 The exoneration penalty at 30% and RYA Alternative Disputes Resolution (as modified by the CHF) will be implemented. Details will be available on the CHF website no later than 1 July and will also be posted on the Official Notice Board.

10 SCORING (*this changes RRS A2*)

- 10.1 Two races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 10.2 (a) When fewer than four races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
(b) When four races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
(c) When five or six races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

- (d) When seven or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her three worst scores.

11 PRIZES

- 11.1 Prize giving will take place after racing on Friday 24 August.
- 11.2 Prizes will be awarded for each event according to the declared number of entries:
three entries – 1 prize, five entries – 2 prizes, seven entries – 3 prizes;
each additional nine entries – 1 prize.

- 11.4 Team event: any club may nominate to the race office before the first race on Tuesday a team of up to five boats, each helmed by a member of that club. No more than two of those boats may sail in the same event except in a handicap event where no more than two of those boats may be from the same class (only one boat from events with fewer than six entries). Places of the best three boats will count, plus the next best in the event of a tie, points being scored according to their overall places.

12 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 12.1 A boat is entirely responsible for its own safety, whether afloat or ashore, and nothing, whether in the Notice of Race or Sailing Instructions or anywhere else, reduces this responsibility.
- 12.2 It is for the boat to decide whether it is fit to sail in the conditions in which it will find itself. By launching or going to sea, the boat confirms that it is fit for those conditions and that its crew is competent to sail and compete in them.
- 12.3 The boat is required to hold adequate insurance and in particular to hold insurance against third party claims in the sum of at least £2m.
- 12.4 Nothing done by the organisers will reduce the responsibility of the boat nor will it make the organisers responsible for any loss, damage, death or personal injury, however it may have occurred, as a result of the boat taking part in the racing. The organisers encompass everyone helping to run the event
- 12.5 The provision of patrol boats does not relieve the boat of its responsibilities.

13 BOATS AND COMPETITORS IN DIFFICULTY

When the race committee considers that a boat or competitor is in difficulty it may instruct the boat or competitor to accept outside help, retire or sail ashore.

D. Access, Boat Parking, Car Parking, Accommodation & Camping:

D.1 Competitors will be issued with wristbands, to be worn for the week, to validate access to HISC.

D.2 Owing to limited parking space only one car park permit per entry will be issued.

D.3 Competitors are requested to park boats and cars with due care, complying with attendants' guidance and ensuring that vehicles do not obstruct the main causeway, or access to / egress from the club for emergency, contractors' and delivery vehicles. Any vehicle causing an obstruction will be removed.

D.4 No camping, vans or sleeping on HISC site overnight is allowed other than in official club accommodation.
